

### Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program:

- Bright Futures Florida Medallion Scholarship (BFFMS) students enrolled in an associate degree program at any of the 28 State College/Community College receive 100 percent of tuition and specific fees. Upon completing an associate degree, the student can use his or her award to pursue a baccalaureate degree and receive 75 percent of tuition and specific fees.
- Students will be evaluated based on official test scores from the FDOE repository for test taken up to June 30 after graduation. To ensure OSFA obtains official test scores: Ensure demographics on your test registration and high school transcript match; and request official test scores be sent to **one** of Florida's 12 state universities when registering for the ACT®/SAT®:
