Inclusion

Highlights from IDEA

IDEA has a strong preference for educating students with disabilities in regular classes with appropriate aides and services. The general education classroom must be the first placement considered by the IEP team. Students with disabilities should be removed from the regular educational environment only when the nature or severity of the disability is such that education in regular classes, with the use of supplementary aides and services cannot be achieved satisfactorily.

Accessing the General Education Curriculum

Students with disabilities must have access to the general education curriculum. In Florida this means all students must receive instruction aligned with the Florida Standards which align directly with the Florida Statewide Assessment (FSA).

Students with disabilities access the general education through differentiated instructional methods, unique accommodations and support to enhance learning, curricular modification and assessment based upon the Florida Standards Assessment and the Florida Alternate Assessment.

Each student's individual Educational Plan (IEP) provides details about the supports and services that the student receives and indicates necessary accommodations or modifications.

Dear Parent or Guardian:

We would like to inform you that your child may be eligible to participate in the John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program, commonly known as the McKay Scholarship Program. This program was created to provide educational options to parents of students with disabilities. Currently, more than 30,000 Florida students are participating in this program.

By participating in the McKay Scholarship Program, your student may be able to attend a different public school in your district, attend a public school in an adjacent district, or receive a scholarship to attend a participating private school.

To be eligible for the McKay Scholarship Program, a student must apply for the program prior to withdrawing from public school. The student must have an Individual Education Plan (IEP), or 504 Accommodation Plan issued under s. 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (with duration of more than six months), and

- Have been enrolled and reported for funding in a Florida public school for the school year prior to applying for a scholarship (Grades K-12); or
- Have been a pre-kindergarten student who was enrolled and reported for funding in a Florida public school during the school year prior to applying for a scholarship; or
- Have received specialized instructional services under the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program from an approved provider pursuant to s. 1002.66 during the previous school year; or
- Have attended the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind during the preceding school year's student membership surveys (Grades K-12).

To find out if your student is eligible, you may apply for the McKay Scholarship Program on the School Choice website at www.floridaschoolchoice.org. Select the McKay Scholarships link, then Parents, and then the link titled Apply for a McKay Scholarship.

To learn more about your child's educational options, please contact your school district's Exceptional Student Education Office at 850-674-8734. You may also contact the Department of Education, Office of Independent Education and Parental Choice Information Hotline at 1-800-447-1636, or visit the School Choice website at www.floridaschoolchoice.org and click the McKay Scholarships link.

In order for a student to be eligible for the program, intent to participate in the McKay Scholarship Program must be filed on the School Choice website prior to withdrawing from public school.

The deadline to apply for the first payment period of the 2017-18 school year is July 3, 2017.

Please note this letter serves to notify you that your child may be eligible to participate in the McKay Scholarship Program. This letter does not quarantee your student's eligibility.

Florida Students Achieve Website

The website is live at www.FloridaStudentsAchieve.org.
